Marriages

- * All couples must give at least 3 months notice of their marriage to the parish and also to the Civil Registrar.
- * All couples are required to do an approved Pre-Marriage Course and this should be completed at least six months before their wedding. *ACCORD* courses are the approved Pre-marriage courses in the Diocese of Kerry.
- * If either of the couple is under 18 years of age, <u>6 months</u> notice is required.
- * For couples getting married in Rome: Irish weddings will be celebrated in Rome only if 3 months notice has been given to the Church and the Department of Foreign Affairs.
