Be Generous

Some situations seem beyond our abilities to cope and the challenge seems too great. Today's gospel offers an example of apparent powerlessness. Jesus is faced with a very large crowd of hungry people and the resources to feed them don't seem to be there. Philip grumbles that, 'Two hundred denarii would only buy enough to give them a small piece each,' and while Andrew sees that there is a small boy present with five barley loaves and two fish, he asks with a shrug, 'What is that between so many?

Jesus did not share the apostles' sense of defeatism. He saw that in some way the small boy with the five barley loaves and two fish was the key to feeding five thousand people. It was just enough food for a simple meal for a poor family. Yet the boy was willing to part with his barley loaves and his fish. When he handed them over, in some mysterious way, Jesus was able to work with the young boy's generous gift to feed everyone. One generous boy was the key to feeding the multitude. One person's generosity gave Jesus the opening that he needed.

The Lord can work powerfully in and through the very little that we possess, if we are generous with what we possess. The small boy is our teacher in that regard. The Lord does not work in a vacuum; he needs us to create an opening for him to work.

Today's gospel teaches us never to underestimate the significance of even the tiniest efforts we make to be generous with the resources we have at our disposal, whether it is resources of money, or time or some ability or other.

There is a link between what happened in the desert that day and what happened at the Last Supper and what happens at every Eucharist. Just as Jesus transformed the small boy's simple gifts of five barley loaves and two fish into a feast for thousands, so he transforms our simple gifts of bread and wine into a spiritual feast for all, the bread of life and the cup of salvation.

Prayer for Healing Victims of Abuse

God of endless love, ever caring, ever strong, always present, always just: You gave your only Son to save us by the blood of his cross.

Gentle Jesus, shepherd of peace, join to your own suffering the pain of all who have been hurt in body, mind, and spirit by those who betrayed the trust placed in them.

Hear the cries of our brothers and sisters who have been gravely harmed, and the cries of those who love them. Soothe their restless hearts with hope, steady their shaken spirits with faith. Grant them justice for their cause, enlightened by your truth.

Holy Spirit, comforter of hearts, heal your people's wounds and transform brokenness into wholeness. Grant us the courage and wisdom, humility and grace, to act with justice. Breathe wisdom into our prayers and labours. Grant that all harmed by abuse may find peace in justice.

We ask this through Christ, our Lord. Amen.
