A NOTE FROM FR. JIM.....

This weekend we celebrate the 17th Sunday in Ordinary Time for Year B. Why do I point this out? Because it is a very significant Sunday - it marks an interruption in our semi continuous reading through the Gospel of Mark and the insertion of a very important chapter from the Gospel of John, that is the famous chapter called the Bread of Life Discourse from John 6. If you've ever studied anything about the Eucharist you'll know that John 6 is one of the central passages in the entire Bible that teaches us about the reality and the mystery of Christ's presence in the Eucharist. So what the church does is during Year B she takes five weeks off from focusing on the Gospel of Mark and instead uses five Sundays in a row to walk step-by-step through the account of Jesus' actions in the sixth chapter of the Gospel of John, beginning with today's gospel which is the feeding of the 5000. So for these 5 Sundays what we should do is just pay close attention to the significance of these Gospel readings and we'll see as we move through the next five Sundays why the church thinks that these passages are so important that every third year, when we're studying the Gospel of Mark, she interrupts that Gospel to focus our attention on one of the foundational texts in the New Testament for our belief in the Eucharist, which is the source and the summit of the Christian life. Our Gospel today begins chapter 6 of John's Gospel with the miracle (or as St. John calls them signs) of the loaves and fishes. Scott Hahn and his wife Kimberly who were both protestant biblical scholars once dedicated themselves to prove that Catholics misinterpreted John chapter 6 and Jesus didn't intend to be literal when He said 'unless you eat my flesh and drink my blood' (John 6:53) and when they completed their deep investigation they both realised that the Catholic Church got it right and they both converted. Please God the Catholics who've lost their faith in the Eucharist will rediscover what Scott and Kimberly realised that Jesus is truly present in the Eucharist, body, blood, soul and divinity and hopefully over these 5 weeks as we meditate on the Gospel we may also discover the amazing love that inspires the Eucharist.
