This Sunday we hear John's account of the miracle of the feeding of the 5000 men, not counting the women and children – about 25,000. Jesus looks out at the people and sees that they are hungry. He also knows how many people there are and what it would take to feed them all. He tests Philip by asking him where they could buy some bread to feed the people even though He knew exactly what he was going to do. Andrew said there was a small boy with five barley loaves and two fish, but all seemed impossible!! But nothing is impossible for God. Jesus took the loaves, gave thanks, and gave them out to all who were sitting down. He then did the same with the fish, giving out as much as they wanted, and the scraps left over from the meal filled 12 baskets. This miracle is a foreshadowing of the Eucharist. It shows how Jesus will later give Himself as the Bread of Life for all. Jesus showed compassion for the people by satisfying their hunger, both physically and spiritually. God can transform something little into something great. We must be

generous and open, trusting in His divine providence. The boy generously gave his loaves and fish to Jesus and He transformed them into something great! Through His generosity and compassion, Jesus continues to nourish us physically and spiritually at every celebration of the Eucharist. This miracle allows us to experience the presence of Jesus in our daily lives. We must also respond to Jesus' generosity and compassion by responding to the needs of our community, sharing our gifts, our faith and living our values. St Paul tells us in the second reading this Sunday, we must be humble, gentle and patient. He reminds us that we are all one in Christ sharing one Faith and one Baptism. We ask Jesus to bless what we have so that it can be more than enough to generously share with others who are hungry either physically or spiritually or both. Amen!
