Saint Ignatius of Loyola (1491 – 1556): Feast Day 31st July

On Wednesday 31 July 2024, we celebrate the Feast Day of Saint Ignatius of Loyola (1491 – 1556). He was born into a Spanish noble family and in his youth was a soldier and not too interested in religion. However in 1521 he was injured in a battle at Pamplona and during his recovery he read the Bible and the Lives of different Saints and this made him dedicate himself to the Lord. From 1528 on he studied in Paris (France) and there with Saint Francis Xavier and five other companions took vows of chastity and poverty in 1534 and founded the Society of Jesus or the Jesuits, as they are commonly known, in 1537. Ignatius was the first superior general of the order and moved to Rome in 1541 where he died on 31st July 1556. He was beatified on 27th July 1609 and canonised on 12th March 1622 along with Saint Francis Xavier, Saint Teresa of Avila, Saint Isidore the Farmer and Saint Philip Neri.
