Jostling for the best seats

We might expect better of the apostles than jostling for places. Although they had spent so much time in the company of Jesus, observing his manner and hearing his teaching, they were still wide of the mark in what he expects from us. Jesus himself set the pattern for us all. Though he was in the form of God, he emptied himself, taking the form of a slave (Phil. 2:6f.)

Mark reports Jesus predicting his passion three times within quite a short period of time. The first was in Caesarea Philippi just after Peter's profession of faith (8:31-33). The second (today's reading) is in Galilee just after the healing of the dumb man (9:30-32). The third was on the road to Jerusalem just after the teaching about leaving everything for the sake of the Gospel (10:32-34).

These three passion predictions resound like the solemn tolling of a bell. Jesus is in the thick of his ministry but is steadily moving towards Jerusalem where all was to be brought to fulfilment. Of the three accounts the one we have today is the simplest and is regarded as the most primitive.

In each case the disciples misunderstand what Jesus is trying to say. But they realise that a new age is dawning and they want to be at the very heart of it; that's surely why they were arguing about who was the greatest. They were slow on the uptake because it was a hard message to take to heart, and that's why Jesus repeats it on several occasions.

When we gather in Church week by week, it's in order to pray and worship God together. We are Christ's disciples in the world today, trying our best to live as he wants us to live. As we try to live out the Gospel in our daily lives, we know that we frequently fail, but with the help of God we start again each day.

"If anyone wants to be first he must make himself last of all and servant of all." This is at the heart of the Gospel, as Jesus' own recipe for discipleship. He wants us to be willing to be of service of all. If this sounds like a tall order, it is still an essential part of following the one who gave his life for us. He valued each and every person, and changed their lives for the better. His followers should aim to do no less.
