## A NOTE FROM FR. JIM.....

I've often heard that sometimes you have coincidences and then other times you have Godincidences. Well I think we've a Godincidence here. This weekend we begin our Catechism program called Matanoia and the first video presentation asks the Jesus question: 'Who do you say I am?.' Which just so happens to be this weekend's Gospel, coincidence or Godincidence? God only knows!! Our video this week is excellent as it reflects on the Jesus question, 'Who do you say I am?', who do you say God is? Who's God for you? What's your image of God. The video discusses the many wrong ideas people have of God. He could be a very mean and heartless God which could be formed by a harsh home experience like having cruel parents and a loveless home. Or He's a distant God who doesn't really care what I do anyway, which could be very convenient if I am living an immoral life. The circumstances of our lives can form our view of God. If things go wrong in life he's obviously punishing us for things we've done wrong, if we make a wish and it comes true He's a genie in a bottle or a Santa Claus. So we see instead of being formed in God's image we instead form God in our own image. I believe that this Catechism program is excellent and having the opening theme with the Jesus question is vital, especially during this time we live in. Caesarea Philippi the backdrop for this question is very telling. In that beautiful place in the holy land is a cliff face where the Romans set up their many God's and idol's. Today as catholic Christian's in Ireland we live in a time of many competing god's and idol's. Many different alternative religions and spiritualities. Today too our faith is up against countless numbers of false gods that a materialistic, secular and atheistic world brings. Having a deep personal relationship with God today is so important. I read recently that the great Frank Duff of the Legion of Mary noted that in the 1960's & 1970's in Ireland our church's were packed but unfortunately by people who had very little faith because the church failed to evangelise them (pray, pay and obey). So when the perfect storm of secularism, materialism and atheistic beliefs swept the country plus the revelations of the church's hidden evils the Irish catholic stood no chance without the deep roots of faith to prevent the collapse of the church. Coming to know who God really is and coming into a deep intimate and personal relationship with Him is the purpose of our Matanoia program.
