### About Today

As we move into the darker times of the year, the readings at Mass remind us more and more of the end of time, and the glory awaiting believers. We trust that God stays with us always.

### Penitential Rite

Preparing ourselves to celebrate the Eucharist to move from darkness to light, we call to mind moments when there was darkness in our own lives and we ask God for healing

### Prayer

Your creation, O God, runs its appointed course, as from the ends of the earth you gather a people you call your own. Confirm us in the strength of your abiding word. Steady our hearts in the time of trial, so that on the day of the Son of Man we may without fear rejoice to behold his appearing. We ask this through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, God for ever and ever.

### Introduction to the Scripture Readings

**Daniel 12:1-13** — Daniel gives a prophecy of the end of time, when the virtuous will be rewarded.

**Hebrews 10:11-14, 18** — What many priests did in former times, Christ does now: he has achieved our perfection.

**Mark 13:24-32** — Jesus repeats Daniel's prophecy, adding that only the Father knows when the end will come.

### Seeing Your Life Though The Lens Of The Gospel, Mk 13:24-32



1. Jesus speaks of the established order falling apart, but the collapse of the old order opened the way for new possibilities. Our church is in crisis, and the world is facing climate disaster. Where have you seen something new and hopeful emerge in the midst of all this, e.g. some action arising from better eco awareness (less waste, a community garden, et al)?

2. The parable of the fig tree. Even in winter it begins to put forth leaves which give a hint of the fruit to come. Where have you found signs of hope in a wintry situation – in your own life, in the life of some group, in the life of the Church, in our world?

3. Jesus proposes no clear time-scale for the events being foretold, so the final sentence (v.32) is a call to alertness, because God can come to us in different ways each day. What difference does it make to you when you are able to live the present moment to the full?
