## A NOTE FROM FR JIM....

This Sunday night @ 7pm, in the Barradubh Community Hub we'll be meeting up again to pray together and to watch another beautiful video from the Metanoia series called: 'Jesus Calls and Empowers'. During the video Fr. Dave focuses on being called by God. Bishop Christian Riesbeck reflects on his calling to the priesthood, Mother Iliana shares her experiences around her vocational call. Fr. Dave ponders on Jesus calling the blind man Bartimaeus to himself. And the beautiful story of Zacchaeus being called down from the sycamore tree. But it was only when Fr. Dave mentioned another calling, the one where Jesus calls out Lazarus from the grave, that I understood the purpose of all Jesus' callings. He explained that when Jesus calls, it's an attempt by God to bring us out of the tomb of darkness into His glorious and wonderful light of love. All the other callings mentioned above are the same.

A vocation is a call to bring someone from where they are to where God wants them to be. The blind man was brought from darkness into light. And Zacchaeus was brought from the darkness of sin into the light and truth of God's love. Our challenge this week is to ask Jesus what tomb is he calling us out of? Negativity? Gossiping? Trapped by the guilt of our past? A sinful relationship? Poor self image? A bad habit? May the light of the Holy Spirit illuminate our conscience to help us see from what tomb God is calling us out of. He never stops calling us into a better life. He never stops loving us and gazing upon us with love and mercy. Let us never fear accepting His Call.
