### A NOTE FROM FR JIM....

This Sunday @ 7pm we'll resume our Metanoia catechism program. This week's episode is called 'This teaching is hard', which will focus on the hard teachings of Jesus. It's again another wonderful program which is a real eye opener on the challenges of being a true Christian. Bishop Robert Barron wrote recently ' It always strikes me as odd that somehow it is assumed that those who believe in God expect their lives to be a bowl of cherries. Absolutely nothing in the Bible or in the great tradition of the Church should lead us to expect this'.

Sometimes we turn a blind eye to the Cross and think salvation can be found by another route. To be a true follower of Christ automatically makes us opponent's to the evil forces of this world, which means the Cross. But embracing these challenges with love is the key. Jesus wants us to know that true life can only come from true love and He invites us to deny ourselves every day and take up our cross and follow him.
