What Must We Do?

The Baptist's preaching shook the consciences of the people. He was saying loud and clear: it was necessary to change, to come back to God, to prepare themselves to welcome the Messiah. Some approached him with this question: What must we do?

John the Baptist has very clear ideas. You need to welcome the Messiah by looking attentively to those in need. Speaking directly, he summarizes everything in this statement: *"Anyone who has two tunics must share with the one who has none, and anyone with something to eat must do the same"*. And we – what must we do to welcome Christ?

Before all else, we must make a greater effort to know who is struggling in our midst. We cannot be oblivious to what is happening around us locally or nationally. And we do not have to look very far from our front doors. A simple visit, a genuine connection might be all that is called for from us. Perhaps something more, but we won't know unless that initial contact is made.

Our hearts are more open at this time of the year. That is certainly a good thing. However, it is not enough to be generous once in a while. It should be our natural inclination. There are people struggling for the daily necessities of life twelve months of the year, not just in late December.

Patient Hope

Teach us to live in patient hope. Too often we seek the immediate answer, the quick fix, the spontaneous response, unwilling to wait for the wisdom that comes from the pause, from the quiet, from the listening to you.

Too often we give up hope when the answers do not come swiftly, when relationships are not mended instantly, when we feel our plans moving backward, not forward.

Help us to take the long view, the eternal view, and give us patience to wait in joyful hope. Amen.
