A NOTE FROM FR JIM...

As we come closer now to the end of our Advent season and as our prayer intensifies in our excitement and anticipation in welcoming Jesus into our hearts, we reflect back on the different characters the church introduced to us throughout Advent, the likes of Isaiah, John the Baptist, Joseph and others. But now as we come to the 4th Sunday of Advent we're presented with the Advent figure par excellence, Our Blessed Mother Mary, the Mother of God. So who are the two figures responsible for the coming of Christ in history? The answer is found in the Nicene Creed. 'We believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son our Lord, conceived by the Holy Spirit and Incarnate of the Virgin Mary'. The Holy Spirit and the Blessed Virgin Mary together bring the 'Word' (God) into this world. So as we get closer to the commemoration of God being born into the world, we're also praying that God will be born into our hearts and lives, that God may take become present in us.

For this to happen, we obviously like the first coming need the power of the Holy Spirit and the powerful intercession of Our Lady's. Right throughout history Mary has never stopped trying to get all her children to open up their hearts to God and bring us all back safely to our heavenly home. During this month of December we're so blessed to celebrate one of those great missions of Mary where she in December 9th, 1531, appeared to a poor, 57-year-old widower named Juan Diego in the hills outside Tenochtitlan, Guadalupe Mexico, Of all Our Lady's apparitions this for me is one of the most amazing. Jesus says you'll know them by their fruit and the fruit of this amazing miracle and apparition was the conversion to Christ of some nine million Aztecs in just a few short years. The power of the image of Our Lady of Guadalupe also took the peoples away from practicing human sacrifices. The Miraculous image has baffled scientists since. I would really encourage you to read up on it and discover the amazing heart of Mary and how she does all in her power to save us.
