What must I do?

'What must we do?' is a question that begins today's Gospel. It is a question we will often find ourselves asking. For us as followers of Jesus, as people who have been baptized into Christ, the question becomes 'What does the Lord want me to do?' 'What is the Lord asking of me?' The answer to that question won't always be easy to find. We may need guidance. The people in today's gospel looked to John the Baptist for guidance. We too may need to talk to someone who can help us to see what it is we must do. We each have to work out what the call of the gospel means for us in our own specific circumstances of life: what must I do no one else can do, that no one else is called to do, because my circumstances in life are unique to me? ~ Fr Gerard

A Jubilee Year is held every twenty-five years. Pope Francis will officially open the year by opening a Holy Door in St Peter's Basilica, Rome on Christmas Eve.
