

God alone can give faith, but you can offer witness.

## Symbols and Gestures used in Baptism

## Sign of the Cross

A stamp on something is a sign of its origin or ownership. The sign of the cross which we make on our child's forehead claims him or her for Christ **Oils** 

The oil of Catechumens and the oil of Chrism are used in the Baptism ceremony. The child is anointed on the chest in order to give strength to grow and live as a Christian. The child's head is anointed with the oil of Chrism. This anointing is a sign of a special calling to build up God's Kingdom in our world

#### Water

Water nurtures and sustains life. In Baptism the water symbolizes the gift of new life that comes to our child.

## White Garment

This garment is a sign of innocence and the new life of resurrection.

#### Candles

The Baptismal Candle is lit from the Paschal Candle. It reminds us that the light of Christ has entered the child's life, and its flame symbolizes the flame of faith which will burn throughout the life of the child.

## Baptismal Register

Your baby's baptism will be on record in the Baptismal register. In the years ahead, proof of Baptism may be obtained in the form of a certificate. Your child's confirmation, marriage or ordination will also be noted alongside.

Breakthrough Cancer Research is the leading cancer research charity in Ireland, supporting more than 165 researchers at 13 institutions across the Island. We focus our research on developing new diagnostics and better treatments for poor prognosis and currently incurable cancers. In 2023, we launched a brand-new All Ireland Cancer Network (AllCaN) which brought together all of the stakeholders in oesophageal cancer for a €1M collaborative project to significantly improve the survival rates of people diagnosed with this cancer. The second AllCaN will focus on Pancreatic cancer and will launch early in 2025. Your support will help accelerate our research of these and other difficult to treat cancers such as lung, brain, liver, stomach and ovarian.
